Reflections from Fr. Martin ~ 4th Sunday of Easter ~ April 21st, 2024

I'm frequently asked many extraordinary questions on our faith. Please continue to ask away! I will happily answer them every chance I get (like today!)

Can I receive communion more than once in a day? Under what circumstances can I?

Canon Law allows you to receive "again" on any given day. Some have misinterpreted to mean "over and over, as many times as you like!" When the Church says "again" they mean "twice," as long as you are participating in the respective two Masses (responding, singing, etc.)

Although Fr. Martin could only appreciate everyone's presence for liturgies, we must all remember that we are visiting God Himself. Therefore, men should always wear at least a collared shirt as well as slacks, and women should always wear either dresses or appropriate slacks and blouses.

This is not so-much because of modesty (important as that is), but because of **respect**. The consensus of Biblical scholars agree that the reason Saint Peter put on his outer garments in John 21:7 was to show **respect**, as he knew he was approaching God. Thank you for your consideration.

<u>THE TRUTH ABOUT THE SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF</u> <u>THE SICK (KNOWN AS "LAST RITES")</u>

Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament that is received by those who are ill or suffering. By the sacred anointing, the whole Church commends those who are sick to Christ. The sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gifts of strength, faith, peace, and courage, and his or her suffering is united with the suffering of Christ for the building up of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC], nos. 1520-23.

Through the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, the Church carries out Jesus' mission of compassion and healing for those who are ill. Those who are sick can be signs of faith and witnesses of Christ's Resurrection to the entire community (Saint John Paul II, Chritifideles Laici no.54).

"Is there someone sick let them call for the priest."

This quote, more appropriately, exhortation, comes from the Epistle of St. James and relates especially to sacramental care! Some are reticent to contact the parish priests because it might frighten or bring fear to one who is ill — so they delay calling the priest until (God forbid!) death is imminent. This is both erroneous and unfortunate. There have been tragic times where I was less than 5 minutes way, immediately left to administer the sacraments, but because the family waited until the "last breath" it was too late! Since Vatican Council II, The Church in her pastoral desire to offer comfort and care to both the patient and those who stand with the sick it is no longer conceived, as "LAST RITES", RATHER IT IS THE "SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING", to give new life, and its' prayers speak of healing and restoration of life. It should not be deferred but administered at the beginning of one's illness, so this person can be assured in their faith and reminded of God's mercy. Don't wait to the point of rushing the arrival of a priest on time but appreciate the affirmation it extends and inspires.

If you or a family member is hospitalized at a health facility or in need of the comfort and grace of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at home, please contact the Parish as soon as you become aware of the need. PLEASE don't wait until the "last minute," as not only that wasn't the purpose of this sacrament, you risk your loved ones not receiving the sacrament in-time for their passing from this life. **NOTICE:** Many have inquired about the meaning of Holy Redeemer's art. A detailed explanation is available on our website. Those who wish for a free hard copy, you can find it on our website or may request one in the front office

PFC 10.26.2022 Tuition Assistance

Tuition Assistance

The Parish Finance Council recognizes the importance of religious education for Children. Holy Redeemer Catholic Church may provide tuition assistance to parish families in accordance with provisions approved by the Parish Finance Council on 10.26.2022.

In order for Holy Redeemer Catholic Church to provide tuition assistance to parish families, there is an expectation that weekly offerings to the "First Collection" will equal an annual minimum of \$800. If it is not possible to contribute these funds, attempts will be made by the parish to offer other opportunities for stewardship, on a case by case basis.

Families are required to obtain Tuition Assistance forms from the schools where their students are enrolled. After completing the forms please forward them to the Holy Redeemer Catholic Church's Finance Office for approval. Upon approval, the Finance Office will contact the applicant to pick up the form. It is the Finance Office's suggestion to hand deliver the approved form to the school's billing office for delivery assurance.

Schools will bill Holy Redeemer Catholic Church directly for 50% of the first child's tuition. Tuition Assistance forms for high school students as participating parishioners verifies that the student deserves the Catholic tuition rate.
